## USASF CHEERABILITIES DIVISIONS OFFERED AT THE REGIONAL SUMMIT

The CheerABILITIES Exhibition division is permitted at The Regional Summit Championships and will not need a bid to exhibition. CheerABILITIES Novice & Elite divisions are not offered at The Regional Summit.

## CROSSOVER POLICY AND FEE

Crossover athletes must pay an additional registration fee for each additional team performance. However, if there is an athlete that is on a Paid Bid team & crossing over to another Paid Bid team, there will be no crossover fee applied. If an athlete is on a Paid Bid team as well as a Partial-Paid or At-Large Bid team, that athlete will be required to pay the crossover fee.

## COMPETING AT THE REGIONAL SUMMIT AND THE YOUTH SUMMIT/SUMMIT/D2 SUMMIT

Athletes competing at the Regional Summit in the USASF Elite divisions or IASF divisions are allowed to compete at The Youth Summit, The Summit or The D2 Summit. Athletes may only represent one program throughout The Summit Championships. These athletes will not be considered crossovers as they are different events.

## TEAM ELIGIBILITY

Any team that competes AND receives a bid in one of the above divisions to The Regional Summit at a qualifying event in the 2026-2027 season. Teams must be in good standing with the USASF, IASF & Varsity Spirit.

Teams MUST compete in the same division in which they qualified for but can add up to the MAXIMUM number of athletes in the division. For example, a team qualifying with 16 athletes may compete at the Regional Summit with up to 22 athletes.

Teams that qualify in a coed division but no longer meet the roster requirements for coed **will NOT** be eligible to compete in the comparable all girl division, and vice versa. Should this situation arise, teams will be required to compete for a new bid.

Should a situation arise where a Coed team loses their Coed status POST final bid deadline, teams are required to compete in the Coed division and still maintain the Coed scoring requirement. All-Girl teams will not be permitted to add a boy and compete in an all-girl division.

Prep, Novice & CHEERABILITIES teams do not need to qualify to attend The Regional Summit and are not eligible for bids.

## D2 PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY AT THE SUMMIT

Each PROGRAM must declare which end of season event the ENTIRE PROGRAM plans to attend. A PROGRAM may not compete for a Summit Bid and a D2 Summit Bid at the same qualifying event. Once a team in a

program receives a bid to the Summit, the ENTIRE PROGRAM is no longer eligible to accept D2 Summit Bids for the remainder of the season. This does not include teams in the International Divisions.

Both D1 and D2 Programs may compete in the International Divisions at The Summit. International Divisions are not D1/D2 eligible to be split, therefore if a D2 program earns a Summit Bid in the International Divisions, their D1/D2 status is not impacted.

The following USASF Program definition and classification will be followed:

*USASF Member Profile for Division Eligibility (program size) All athletes are associated with a single USASF program profile. The member database will count the total number of competitive cheer athletes in the PROGRAM to determine the program size. Programs with 125 or fewer athletes will qualify for Division II when Division II is an option at that particular event. Programs with 125 or fewer athletes may, through their member profile, opt-in to Division I. Once a program opts-in and/or competes as a Division I program, they must remain Division I for the remainder of the season.*

## SCORING AT THE REGIONAL SUMMIT

Elite teams will compete twice at The Regional Summit (Saturday & Sunday). The Regional Summit Championships will utilize a floating score system.

- Results will be a combination of a team's round one (Saturday) and round two (Sunday) scores.
- The highest daily score will amount to 75% and the lower daily score will amount to 25%. Prep and Novice teams will compete once at The Regional Summit. CheerABILITIES teams will exhibition once at The Regional Summit (CHEERABILITY competitive divisions are not offered).

## INTERNATIONAL DIVISIONS - SCORING

Teams competing in the International Divisions will be scored on the standard Varsity All Star Score Sheet. At all US based, regular-season Varsity All Star events, all teams must adhere to the USASF level rules when competing.

## BID INFORMATION

### AT LARGE BIDS

At all Varsity All Star events, the top 3 placing teams in bid eligible divisions will earn an At-Large Bid for The Regional Summit Championships.

### PARTIAL PAID BIDS

A Partial-Paid bid is equal to 25% of the athlete registration fee. Each team will be eligible to accumulate up to 4 Partial-Paid bids which is equivalent to 1 Paid bid during the 2026- 2027 season.

- *\*If additional athletes are added to the roster after the Partial Paid Bid was earned, the gym is responsible for the full cost of the additional athletes.*

The allocation of monetary bids awarded to rostered athletes is at the sole discretion of the gym competing.

### FULL PAID BIDS

A Paid bid is equal to an athlete registration fee.

*\*If additional athletes are added to the roster after the Paid Bid was earned, the gym is responsible for the full cost of the additional athletes.*

The allocation of monetary bids awarded to rostered athletes is at the sole discretion of the gym competing.

## **PASSING DOWN BIDS**

The Regional Summit Bids will not be passed down. For example, if a team receives an At-Large Bid at an event early in the season and upgrades to a Paid Bid later in the season, the original At-Large Bid will not be given to another team. This bid will be eliminated.

## **UPGRADING BIDS**

- At-Large Bids can be upgraded to a Partial-Paid or Paid Bid.
- Partial-Paid Bids can be upgraded to a Paid Bid.
- Paid Bids must be used this season and cannot be deferred.

## **BID ELIGIBILITY**

Event Producers have the right to investigate any teams receiving a bid to The Regional Summit. Bid eligible teams and divisions will be reviewed for accuracy and legitimacy. Any bid eligible team/athlete found in violation of a USASF, IASF, USA Cheer or Varsity Spirit policy may be disqualified.

Clarification: Prep and Novice divisions are NOT eligible to receive Partial-Paid or Paid Bids.

IASF divisions ARE eligible to receive Partial-Paid or Paid Bids.

Teams must pay the deposit by their deposit deadline to secure their Partial-Paid or Paid Bids. Any payments made prior to earning a Partial-Paid or Paid Bid will be refunded.

## **BID REVEALS**

Full Paid and Partial Paid Bid winners will be announced on the Summit Bid Reveal, which takes place throughout the season for free on Varsity TV, Monday evenings, 7:30 CST/8:30 EST.

## **DIVISION SPLITS**

- All USASF Elite & Prep divisions will be split into D1 & D2.
- IASF divisions and Novice divisions will NOT be split by D1/D2 or size.
- All division splits will be done after the final registration deadline.

## **PRIZES AND AWARDS**

### ***Elite Divisions:***

- All athletes will receive a Day 1 Athlete Gift on Saturday
- All athletes will receive a Day 2 Athlete Gift on Sunday
- All athletes will receive a medal at their Awards ceremony
- All teams will receive a Banner
- Division Champions will receive a Division Champion Backpack
- Level Grand Champions will earn a Championship Ring and a Team Banner
  - Teams will be awarded 4 additional rings to distribute at their choice (Coaches, Choreographers, etc.)

- If there is a tie for Level Grand Champions both teams will receive Champion Rings, there will NOT be a tie breaker.

*\*Level Grand Champions are NOT split D1/D2.*

*\*\*IASF divisions are eligible for Level Grand Champion*

#### **Prep Divisions:**

- All athletes will receive a Day 1 Athlete Gift
- All athletes will receive a medal at their Awards ceremony
- All teams will receive a Banner
- Division Champions will receive a Division Champion Bag

#### **Novice Divisions:**

- All athletes will receive a Day 1 Athlete Gift
- All athletes will receive a medal at their Awards ceremony
- All teams will receive a Banner for competing. Should Novice teams receive a Superior rating, they will receive a banner indicating Superior.

*Clarification: Prep and Novice Divisions are NOT eligible for Level Grand Champion Banners or Level Grand Champion Rings.*

## **HOUSING INFORMATION**

All Regional Summit events are housing required through our Stay Smart Housing program for the 2026-2027 season. Housing will open for bookings for these events in the Fall and our preferred housing partner for these events will be Team Travel Source.
